Useful questions to ask:

Has the job got good prospects for the future?

What do you (a) most enjoy and (b) most dislike about this job?

What qualifications do you need to enter this career?

Are there opportunities to travel/work abroad with this job?

Do you have to keep up-dating your knowledge? How?

Do many women get to the top in this type of work?

How far is new technology altering this job?

Are there good promotion prospects?

Are you expected to move for promotion?

What would be (a) the starting salary? (b) the salary at 30? (c) top salary?

What are the perks of the job?

Does this job affect your lifestyle?

Do you think this job is respected in the community?

Advice

Make good use of the time available to further your understanding both of your own career interests and of specific careers. The list of possible questions above is just to point you in the right direction. You will obviously only have time to ask a few of them. Tick two or three that you wish to ask and plan which stands and talks you wish to visit.

SIXTH FORM—QUESTIONS TO ASK

Useful questions to ask ABOUT Institutions, Courses and Finance:

What sort of grades are required for particular courses? Is General Studies included? For which subjects are interviews usual? What sort of questions will be asked? Will there be an Open Day?

What educational facilities are available?

Availability and cost of accommodation—on campus, in local town

What student services are available—careers, health services?

What sports and social facilities are available—societies, students unions, sports clubs, music, theatre etc?

What was the destination of graduates from the institution or from courses?

What is the course content and structure? - joint, sandwich, modular etc

What is the method of assessment?

What sources of finance are available—eg sponsorship/bursaries?

How desirable is a 'gap' year? How can it be spent and financed?

Advice

Make good use of the time available to further your understanding of how you would apply for courses and jobs, finance and sponsorship/bursaries available and whether a 'gap' year might be desirable. The list of possible questions above is just to point you in the right direction. You will obviously only have time to ask a few of them. Tick two or three that you wish to ask and plan out which stands and talks you want to visit.
