Mrs Iby Knill

Mrs Iby Knill is a writer, an inspirational speaker and the author of "The Women without a Number". She was featured in a BBC1 series called "My Story".

Iby Knill lived in Bratislava in the former Czechoslovakia before World War 2. When the Nazis invaded her country she was a teenager but she escaped into Hungary and joined the resistance. Her group was responsible for rescuing shot-down Allied pilots who had escaped from Germany.

In 1942 Iby was arrested and she spent two years as a political prisoner before being released. She was re-arrested 4 months later and was taken to the Nazi death camp Auschwitz-Birkenau. Later she was sent to a different camp for 9 months. In 1945 as Allied troops drew close to Lippstadt, the camp was abandoned and the Nazis forced Iby and her fellow prisoners to march almost 150 miles towards the notorious Bergen-Belsen Camp before being liberated by US army soldiers.

In 1946 Iby returned to Bratislava to be reunited with her mother and brother but she did not see her father again. She married a serving officer from UK forces and came to live in England. Iby obtained a degree in 1973 at the Open University at the age of 50, a Postgraduate Diploma in Translation in 1980 and an MA in Theology and Religious Studies in 2002, when she was 79 years old. Most of Iby's working life was in Education.

She did not talk to anyone about her horrific experiences during the War for sixty years. It was during a discussion about the Holocaust in her post-graduate studies when Iby decided to share her story.

She is now near to completing her second book which should be published in January 2016.
