# PERSONAL STATEMENTS – RUSSELL GROUP WEBINAR 5<sup>TH</sup> OCTOBER 2022

#### Note

RG refers to Russell Group and PS refers to Personal Statement

The people below, who were at the webinar, are staff representatives of RG universities

## Steph - University of Leeds

There is only the 1 PS – don't focus on just 1 university

Focus on the course/why you are passionate about it/what skills you have that link to the course Universities only see the PS, not the other universities you have applied to How to be course specific? —

- Show you have an interest in course super-curricular activities important eg writing competitions if applying for English courses or visiting museums/listening to podcasts
- Research main parts of a RG course highlight interest in research eg EPQ is a good example or read journals etc
- Joint honours courses apply in same subject area draw similarities/link together
- May be able to submit a separate PS but this is not common

Start to write and see what comes out! – then condense to the word count – no right or wrong way of constructing it – make it formal with paragraphs

3 sections – this is just one suggestion –

- Course (1st paragraph)
- Super-curricular activities /transferable skills/work experience (2<sup>nd</sup> paragraph)
- Contribution to university life /career ideas (3<sup>rd</sup> paragraph)

STAR method – Situation / Task / Action / Result – how to structure your PS (and other things such as CVs) – see website for more details

Be careful with plagiarism factor! Universities use software to detect if applicants have copied from texts and so on

PSs are read by Admissions Tutors – lecturers tend NOT to read them – not at Leeds, anyway Location – personal decision – may like London – capital/busy pace or smaller campus university – Leeds a campus university in a vibrant city, for example - try and visit at least 2 universities in person

#### Louise – University of Liverpool

Speak to universities if you have to – they MAY need a new PS or your application will be enough – could ask for you for one additional paragraph, for example – make sure that the courses allow for 1 PS Common mistakes? – PS too general / trying to impress us with contacts

PS needs to be easy to read – don't have to use overcomplicated, fancy language – it may cut into your character count too (4000 characters) - get to the point! Be expressive but in a professional and accurate way – get others' opinions on how it reads/sounds

#### <u>David – University of Newcastle</u>

Personal skills – useful? Only if relevant – if you are a star hula hooper, probably not relevant but if you are a good organiser, it could well link to the course

Extra-curriculars – key – make sure they are relevant/link to the course you are applying for – sport interest out of school -useful to include as universities are involved in sports teams etc – shows you want to be part of university life

Scholarships – different criteria so need to check – depends on institution – not generic across them all

### Frankie – Durham University

See university websites for guidance – PS is just one part of a whole application

Key – we read every one so helps to be able to distinguish between applicants with similar academic qualifications/predicted grades

We don't interview for all courses – exceptions are primary education and Foundation courses Aim for things that make you stand out – from last 12-18 months – draw out your skills

EPQs – piece of independent research – very beneficial – similar to independent study you will be doing at university

Can be lower requirements if taking one – Durham don't do this but they do value them -mention in PS Don't need EPQ to make a good PS! If you are not taking it, include more of what you do outside school instead

Don't repeat what you are studying in the PS – takes up space – should have better things to write about-showing independent research is better

If no offers and want to defer – think WHY you would want to defer – what you want to do – you don't have to defer – you can try for UCAS EXTRA – think outside the box – look at other universities, not just RG ones perhaps if issue over grades – check the UCAS website – <a href="https://www.ucas.com">www.ucas.com</a> – has tips on this – and talk to those in school to support you
