Students poorly equipped to climb trees	L	M	Students are not able to climb until they have completed the training course, and only then under the supervision of the Canopy instructors.
			Students failing to complete the training course and achieve an acceptable level of proficiency with the equipment as determined by the Canopy instructors will not be allowed to climb.
Climbing line failure	L	Н	Lines are only installed by Canopy Access Ltd. staff. Top anchors and lines are inspected weekly by canopy staff. All students climb on two lines, a primary and secondary line, and fall arrest devices are installed, and students taught how to use them on the secondary line in the unlikely event of a primary line failure.
Panic Attack	L	М	All trees are rigged with two complete sets of lines, and an instructor is able to ascend the same tree and assist a student returning to the ground. Canopy Instructors received extensive training in emergency recovery as part of their BCAP, ACAP and ICAP certifications.

Injury while hiking to	L	М	All students must have a head torch, in addition to their regular trekking kit, as the canopy access
